

September 2018 From the Principal's Desk

Dear Lincoln Parents and Families,

It's that time of year...when the town of Morton turns bright orange for our village's annual Pumpkin Festival. I can remember the excitement and anticipation I felt as a MJHS eighth grader ready for my first ever Pumpkin Festival...and I don't think that I've missed one ever since! Back then, I looked forward to the rides, the food and the fun. Quite a bit older now, I still anxiously look forward to next week! The Pumpkin Festival provides so many wonderful memories...I hope that you and your family are looking forward to making many memories together next week!

Our students have been working hard to "get in the swing" of routines and expectations at the beginning of the school year. Our teachers and staff spend a great deal of time teaching and practicing daily routines in and out of the classroom and practicing behavior expectations throughout our school. We are absolutely LOVING All Day Kindergarten in our district, and our K students are quickly learning the expectations and procedures throughout school, especially in the cafeteria and at recess. This year, we started the year with 523 Lions in grades K-6; last year, we ended the year at 531. However, that enrollment number also included our Early Childhood students (approximately 25 students), so we did see a slight increase to the start of the year.

Looking ahead to September (and after the Pumpkin Festival!), it's a busy month for our PTO...first hosting our New Family Dinner on Monday, 9/17, starting at 6 pm in the cafeteria. New Lincoln families will receive an invitation from our PTO to join us for dinner that evening. Secondly, our PTO's primary fundraiser of the year, our Lincoln School Walk-a-Thon, is set for all day Friday, September 28th. Last Friday, you received information about our Walk-a-Thon, including important turn-in dates, incentives and how you can volunteer and support this effort. We have a lofty goal-raising \$40,000 (last year, we raised over \$38,000), and any way that you can support this goal is so very much appreciated. Coming up next week is our annual tribute to honor and remember the events of September 11, 2001. Each year, we host a Patriot Day Assembly to honor the memory of those lost on that tragic day in American history. This year, we hope to include the many parents, grandparents

and extended family members who have served/are serving in the military or are/were First Responders. Please refer to the message which was emailed home and posted to our school Facebook page on Wednesday, 9/8. We look forward to having those heroes join us at 9 am on 9/11 as part of our assembly. Keep the Car Line Moving at Morning Drop Off

If you are one of our many parents who drop off your child each morning, you know that the drop off line can be a frustrating time, especially on days that it is raining! Please help us ensure

the safety of all by following these procedures each morning:
-PULL YOUR CAR UP TO THE FAR SIGN, EVEN IF THERE IS NO ONE BEHIND YOU. This is usually the biggest reason that our drop off line gets bogged down. By pulling your car all the way to the far sign (to the fence), it allows more cars to come through the drive and drop off students.

-STUDENTS SHOULD EXIT FROM THE PASSENGER'S SIDE, NOT THE DRIVER'S SIDE. It is not safe for children to exit from the driver's side into the passing car traffic. This also forces children to walk between cars to get to the sidewalk and enter school.

-DO NOT PUT YOUR CAR IN PARK AND GET OUT TO ASSIST YOUR CHILD LEAVING THE CAR. This again significantly slows down the drop off line. If you want to help your child out of the car, give him/her a kiss or a hug, assist with getting a bulky item out of the car, please pull into a parking spot and assist your child there.

-DO NOT DROP OFF YOUR CHILDREN ON NEBRASKA AVENUE AND EXPECT THEM TO CROSS THE CIRCLE DRIVE TO ENTER THE SCHOOL. Some parents think that they can avoid the hassle of drop off by letting kids out on Nebraska and having them walk into the school by crossing in front of all of the traffic. Again...drivers are not looking for students to be crossing and children have to cross between cars to get in the building. While it's more convenient for the driver, it ends up slowing down the car line for everyone else.

-FOR THOSE PARENTS WHO PARK THEIR CARS AND WALK THEIR STUDENTS INTO THE BUILDING: Please make sure that you look and wait, if needed, before crossing in front of the cars. Don't just immediately cross, thinking that drivers see you and will stop. (This isn't Kroger or Wal-Mart where

people walk out of the store and into the crosswalk without looking at the cars!) Be aware of the cars, drivers and students when you are crossing with your student.

We greatly appreciate your help to ensure a safe, stress free and hassle free morning drop off for EVERYONE! Or at least significantly reduce the stress of the drop off line! Another way to do that...arrive earlier. Our doors open and student supervision starts at 7:45 am. The drop off line is significantly shorter from 7:45-8 am than it is after 8 am. If you can make that work for your family, then you might have time to grab that special coffee or treat on your way to work or before your return home!



2018-19 SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKER UPDATE

As many of you know, our School Social Worker (SSW), Mrs. Lauren Pratt, resigned about a week before school started last month. Lauren had been our Social Worker at Lincoln for the past six years, but had been commuting from Mahomet every day last year. A position came open in Mahomet right before school started and Mrs. Pratt was offered the position. We were sad to see her leave, but understand it was an opportunity that she could not refuse.

We immediately posted an opening for a SSW and received ZERO applications. With just a few days before the start of the year, we realized that filling the position was going to be difficult, if not impossible. It's our hope that we will post the position again in October in order to secure a Pecember SW graduate. In the meantime, we will share Social Work services with some of the other buildings in the district in order to meet our students' needs. Sharing Social Work responsibilities at Lincoln this year will be:

-Mrs. Kelly Hobson, who is also the SSW at Jefferson, will be at Lincoln on Wednesdays and Friday afternoons.

<u>-Mr Peter Klinkner</u>, who also serves students at MHS, will be here to support students on Fridays.

-Mrs. Laura Steiner, who also works as SSW at Lettie Brown, will work at Lincoln on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

If your child has received social work support last year or has SW minutes written in his/her IEP, you will soon be hearing from our SW team regarding his/her support for this school year.

PROCEDURES FOR EATING LUNCH AT SCHOOL WITH YOUR CHILD

Food brought in by visitors is only for their child(ren); it's not to be shared with others. -If you eat during K or $1^{st}/2^{nd}$ grade lunches, the visitor(s) and child will sit at a designated table in the cafeteria. Students are invited to have 1 friend join him/her with their guest at the designated table. -Celebrating a birthday or special occasion? Please remember that birthday treats can't be brought in and shared with others...even during lunch time.

MEET OUR NEW LITERACY COACH!


All four elementary schools in Morton added a new position to our schools this year-the position of Literacy Coach.

What is a Literacy Coach? In Morton, the primary role of the literacy coaches is to support our teachers in their professional learning. Teachers are learners and can continue to improve their instructional practices and strategies to benefit their students. Literacy coaches will work alongside our teachers to develop their capacity to know their students as readers and learners to make expert instructional decisions.

How will the literacy coaches do this?

Coaches will support daily literacy instruction and daily assessments in our classrooms. They will assist teachers with the analysis of student reading data. Coaches will help teachers to reflect on their instruction and help set student goals. They will also be a resource for supporting teachers and students through formal and informal meetings with teachers, observing instruction, coteaching with teachers, modeling lessons for teachers and assisting with lesson planning.
