Dear Lincoln Families,

Welcome to the month of October! After a busy start to the school year, we are settling in to the school year. We celebrated a fantastic Lincoln PTO Walk-a-Thon last Friday! We are so incredibly fortunate to have so many wonderful supporters for our walk-a-thon. In case you have not heard, we raised \$40,557.50...a new record for Lincoln! We already rewarded those students (125) who met the "dunk tank" incentive level last week. On October 4th, students earning dessert with Ms. Albers and Mrs. Peterson (345 students) will receive their treats at lunch. Just a reminder that the date of the Lock-In has been changed to Friday, November 2nd from 6-9 pm. 117 students will be participating in that activity. Water bottles (170 students) will arrive closer to the end of the month. I can't thank our Walk-a-Thon chairpersons Stacy Litersky and Bonnie Ricci enough for all they did to ensure such a successful day all around! THANK YOU EVERYONE!!

We are quickly approaching the end of the first quarter, which means that Parent Teacher Conferences are just around the corner. Our conferences are set for Thursday, October 18th and Friday, October 19th...and there will be no school on those days. For those families who will be out of town during PT Conferences, teachers will work to schedule those conferences either before school (7:50-8:10 am) or after school (2:45-3:40 pm). Please understand that the flexibility in the times that are available during our normal PT conference days will not be offered for those "make up" conferences. We appreciate your understanding in scheduling those subsequent conference times. Please understand that teachers will meet for only one PT conference for each child. Teachers will not meet separately with each parent. This ensures that everyone hears the same information at the conference and that there are no

misunderstandings about information shared between everyone. Thank you for your understanding of that.

Please be aware that your tentative conference time(s) will come home by Friday, October 5th. We ask that those confirmation slips are returned back to school no later than Friday, October 12th. If the time we have assigned for you does not work for you, the sooner you let us know, the better opportunity we have in re-scheduling to a time that works better for you.

October is a busy month...PT conferences, Book Fair, various musical presentations and the PTO Vendor Fair. We look forward to seeing you at Lincoln...as always, thank you for your wonderful support!

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A Note From the Assistant Principal

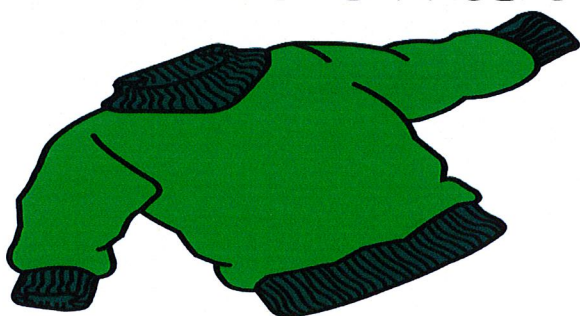

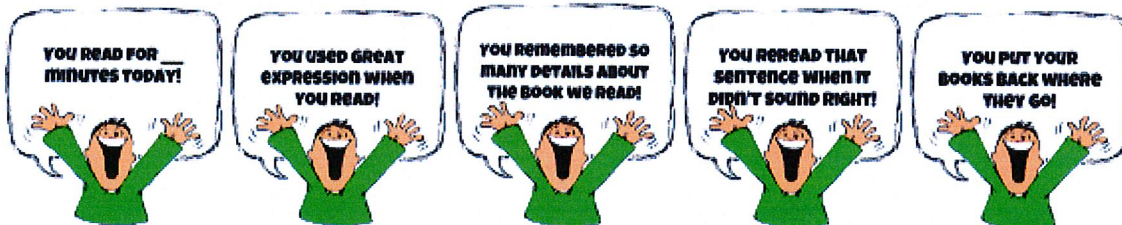
★ Your interactions with books matter too! Seeing family members reading lets your child know that reading is a lifelong activity to be enjoyed.

☐ Find ways to **PRAISE** your child as a reader!

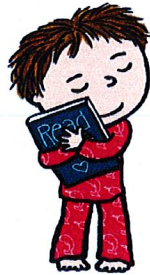
