### LINCOLN ELEMENTARY DESIGNATED AS EXEMPLARY SCHOOL!

On October 31st, the Illinois State Board of Education released the 2017-18 School Report Cards for all Illinois public schools. The school report cards provide a wealth of information about our school and district, include information about our enrollment, student demographics, instructional minutes, teacher experience, district finances, and performance on our state assessment, PARCC. Included on the report cards is a designation for each school. The designations provide a public benchmark of each school's progress goal of preparing all students for success in college and career. The designation is a descriptor of how well the school is meeting the needs of all students. It's based on 10 measures of performance at the school level. Some of these measures include student proficiency in English-Language Arts (ELA), student proficiency in Math, ELA and Math student growth, proficiency of our English Language Learners (ELL), absenteeism, and a school climate survey.

I am so very proud to share that Lincoln Elementary was designated as an **EXEMPLARY SCHOOL**. Only the highest-performing 10% of schools in Illinois receive this designation. The other designations are as follows:

-Commendable: Performance not in the top 10%;

<u>-Underperforming</u>: One or more student groups performing at or below the "all

students" group in the lowest-performing 5% of all schools
-Lowest Performing: In the lowest-

-Lowest Performing: In the lowestperforming 5% of Title I eligible schools statewide

Approximately 400 schools in Illinois were identified as Exemplary. Of the six schools in Morton CUSD 709, Lincoln was the only school designated as exemplary; the other five schools were designated as commendable. ## COLD WEATHER DRESS REMINDERS



•While the weather may be getting colder as winter approaches, it is important for our students to continue to have outdoor recess whenever possible. Typically, students will go outside when the temperature or wind chill is 10 degrees or higher. Recess is about 20 minutes long (a little less by the time the students get coats, hats, gloves/mittens, scarves, boots, etc. on!), so we try to get our students outside as much as the weather allows. There will be times when it's simply too cold or windy to go outside. We do allow students to play in the snow on occasion; students will need to have snow pants and snow boots on to play in the snow. It is important that children are appropriately dressed for outside play; please make sure that your child has cold weather clothing-coats (with zippers that work), hats. gloves/mittens, scarves, snow boots, snow pants-so that they can play outside on cold weather days and stay

warm while they are outside! We appreciate your help!!


