One of the first tasks in the new school year planning is scheduling incoming Kindergarten students for the pre-registration and screening in March. This year, the Pre-Registration and Screening will take place on Thursday, March $22^{\text {nd }}$ from 8 am-7 pm and Friday, March $23^{\text {rd }}$ from 8 am to noon.
This is for children who reside in the Morton CUSD 709 School District and will be five years old by September 1, 2019. The screening and pre-registration is held at the Morton CUSD 709 District

Office, located at 1050 S. Fourth Avenue. Please call 263-2581 to make an appointment.
You will need to bring these documents for your child to your appointment:

- Certified Birth Certificate (the one from the county, not the hospital)
- Immunization records
- Most recent physical exam, dental exam, and vision exam (if you have them). Kindergarten Round Up will be held at a later date this spring. We look forward to welcoming our incoming kindergarten class at that time!

This survey is called 5Essentials and is currently available for parents to take. The survey will close on MARCH 15, 2019. (This is an extension from the original deadline) We are hopeful for a significant percentage of our parents to complete the survey; right now, 28 percent of our parents have completed the survey. The larger the participation, the more information we gain to improve our school. The survey will take approximately 10 minutes to complete. We hope to gain your
insight on five components found to be critical for school success:

1. Effective Leaders: The principal works with teachers to implement a clear and strategic vision for school success.
2. Collaborative Teachers: Teachers collaborate to promote professional growth.
3. Involved Families: The entire school staff builds strong relationships with families and communities to support learning.
4. Supportive Environment: The school is safe and orderly. Teachers have high expectations for students and support students to realize their goals. Classmates also support one another.
5. Ambitious Instruction: Classes are academically demanding and engage students by emphasizing the application of knowledge.
