KEEPING WARM AT RECESS IN WINTER MONTHS



As the snow falls outside over the next few days, our students will be anxious to go outside to play in the snow!

At school, our students go outside for recess when the temperature (factoring in windchill) is above ten degrees Fahrenheit and it is safe to be playing on the blacktop (little to no ice). It's important, even in colder weather, for our students to get outside, exert some energy and get some fresh air.

There are some occasions when even though we are above 10 degrees, we make the decision to keep the students inside for recess. For example, our blacktop had been cleared after our weekend weather, but there were still slick spots and large icy areas. In order to ensure safety for all, we decided to keep students inside. In addition, the snow limits the space we have for our students...leaving just the black top area for 150+ students are each recess.

Recess is about 20 minutes long (a little less by the time the students get their cold weather gear on!), and we try to get our students outside as much as the weather allows. We do allow students to play in the snow on occasion; students will need to have snow pants and snow boots (not fashion boots) to play in the snow, along with mittens/gloves and a coat. Students should bring a different pair of shoes to wear during the day (and for PE) and change into their boots for recess. It is important that children are appropriately dressed for outside play; please make sure that your child has cold weather clothing-coats (with zippers that work), hats, gloves/mittens, scarves, snow boots, snow pants-so that they can play outside on cold weather days and stay warm while they are outside! We appreciate your help!



Gameball Run Kicks Off with Assembly and Coin Collection on 1/21!

Lincoln School began its Gameball Run activities with our Kick Off Assembly on 1/17. MHS Boys' Basketball Coach Matt Franks and Potters and former Lincoln Lions visited our school to tell us about the Gameball Run and the CHOI. We also met John and Christy Getz and Maggie, our Miracle Kid! Maggie is in 5th grade at Lincoln and the Getz's are sharing Maggie's story and the family's gratitude to the CHOI. Our students watched a video which chronicles Maggie's life. We are thankful for the services that CHOI provided for Maggie and all children throughout central Illinois.

Over the next few weeks, students will have an opportunity to participate in several activities to raise funds for CHOI:

- <u>-Coin Wars:</u> The money collection began on 1/21. We will have grade level competitions and instead of counting money, we'll count points to determine the winning grade level. How does it work? When students put coins into their jar, those are "positive," but when students put dollar bills into another grade level's jar (not their own), that is a "negative." In other words, if a student puts 2 quarters in his grade level jar, that is 50 points towards the grade level total...but if another student places a \$1 bill in that same grade level jar, then it is negative 100 points. In the end, our PTO reps will add up the money and tally the points to determine who the winning grade level is in our coin war.
- <u>-T-Shirt Sales:</u> This year's Gameball Run t-shirt is navy with glow in the dark blue letters. By purchasing a t-shirt, you not only donate to the CHOI, but you also gain free entry into the Gameball Run game on Friday, 2/21 if you are wearing your t-shirt. Order forms came home last week!
- <u>-Participation in the Gameball Run itself!</u> Students and parents can choose to join in the run fun by signing up to participate in the run, which will take place on Thursday, 2/20, starting at 4 pm at the MHS track. Info about race sign up/t-shirt came home last week.
- <u>-Socks and Stickers:</u> This year we are also selling socks and stickers. Please look for the order sheet and information in the Gameball Run packet.

Thank you for your support of the Children's Hospital of Illinois. We hope to see many of you on the track during the run and many more in the bleachers on Friday, 2/21 at MHS. 
