Dear Lincoln Parents and Families.

The calendar has turned to September, which means the Morton Pumpkin Festival is just around the corner! In fact, it starts a week from Wednesday! There is always a buzz and excitement in the air at school during Pumpkin Festival Week. It's one of my most favorite memories of growing up in Morton! I hope you and your family enjoy a memorable Pumpkin Festival together!

September also brings two PTO activities-our annual New Family Dinner and our 10^{th} Annual Lincoln Lion Walk-a-Thon! First, our annual New Family Dinner will be held on Monday, September 9^{th} at 6 pm. Our PTO hosts this dinner and invites all new Lincoln families to have dinner at school. We'll enjoy some pizza together, introduce our PTO Board and take a brief tour of the school before the monthly PTO meeting, scheduled for 7 pm. All parents are invited to attend our PTO meeting; child care is provided during the meeting. We hope to see many of our new families at the dinner!

This month also marks the 10th Annual Lincoln Lion PTO Walk-a-Thon. We kicked off our Walk-a-Thon activities with the kickoff assembly last Thursday. I hope you've had a chance to review the information in the white packet which came home with your child last Thursday. We have a lofty goal this year-\$43,000! (We raised just over \$42,000 last year). These funds will help provide our students, teachers and school with a wide variety of materials, programming and activities throughout the school year. We have a dedicated team of parents who are organizing our Walk-a-Thon efforts; you can read more about it further on in the PTO section of the newsletter.

This week will be our first Early Dismissal Wednesday of the school year. Remember that school is dismissed for all K-6 students at <u>11:55 am</u> on the first Wednesday of the month. (This is a change from the 1:10 pm dismissal time last year!) As a special treat, Kona Ice will be at school each Wednesday on our early dismissal days and will be available for purchase. Our Lincoln School activity fund will receive 20% of our monthly early dismissal sales.

We will post on Facebook and send out an email message as to the specific day and time that the sign up forms will be made available on line to all families. Just a reminder that Parent Teacher Conferences will be held on Thursday, October 17th from 8 am to 7 pm and Friday, October 18th from 8 am to noon. Mark your calendars!!

Coming up next week is our annual tribute to honor and remember the events of September 11, 2001. Each year, we host a Patriot Day Assembly to honor the memory of those lost on that tragic day in American history. This year, we again hope to include the many parents, grandparents and extended family members who have served/are serving in the military or are/were First Responders. We look forward to having those heroes join us at 9 am on 9/11 as part of our assembly. Keep the Car Line Moving at Morning Drop Off

If you are one of our many parents who drop off your child each morning, you know that the drop off line can be a frustrating time, especially on days that it is raining! Please help us ensure the safety of all by following these procedures each morning:

-PULL YOUR CAR UP TO THE FAR SIGN, EVEN IF THERE IS NO ONE BEHIND YOU. This is usually the biggest reason that our drop off line gets bogged down. By pulling your car all the way to the far sign (to the fence), it allows more cars to come through the drive and drop off students.

-STUDENTS SHOULD EXIT FROM THE PASSENGER'S SIDE, NOT THE DRIVER'S SIDE. It is not safe for children to exit from the driver's side into the passing car traffic. This also forces children to walk between cars to get to the sidewalk and enter school.

-DO NOT PUT YOUR CAR IN PARK AND GET OUT TO ASSIST YOUR CHILD LEAVING THE CAR. This again significantly slows down the drop off line. If you want to help your child out of the car, give him/her a kiss or a hug, assist with getting a bulky item out of the car, please pull into a parking spot and assist your child there.

-DO NOT DROP OFF YOUR CHILDREN ON NEBRASKA AVENUE AND EXPECT THEM TO CROSS THE CIRCLE DRIVE TO ENTER THE SCHOOL. Some parents think that they can avoid the hassle of drop off by letting kids out on Nebraska and having them walk into the school by crossing in front of all of the traffic. Again...drivers are not looking for students to be crossing and children have to cross between cars to get in the building. While it's more convenient for the driver, it ends up slowing down the car line for everyone else.

-FOR THOSE PARENTS WHO PARK THEIR CARS AND WALK THEIR STUDENTS INTO THE BUILDING: Please make sure that you look and wait, if needed, before crossing in front of the cars. Don't just immediately cross, thinking that drivers see you and will stop. (This isn't Kroger or Wal-Mart where people walk out of the store and into the crosswalk without looking at the cars!) Be aware of the cars, drivers and students when you are crossing with your student.

We greatly appreciate your help to ensure a safe, stress free and hassle free morning drop off for EVERYONE! Or at least significantly reduce the stress of the drop off line! Another way to do that...arrive earlier. Our doors open and student supervision starts at 7:45 am. The drop off line is significantly shorter from 7:45-8 am than it is after 8 am. If you can make that work for your family, then you might have time to grab that special coffee or treat on your way to work or before your return home!

I will also provide additional support through individual and small group counseling/social skills lessons as well as behavior and crisis management to those who demonstrate a need. Monthly Schoolwide Themes and Administrator Read Alouds

For the 2019-2020 school year, we have identified common monthly themes which we will focus on each month.

September Lincoln Literacy!



Hello, Lincoln Lions! I am Olivia Gabbert, your Lincoln Literacy Coach. I will be working with your child's teacher on all things reading and writing! I taught first grade for 14 years, and finished my first year of coaching last year. I have my Masters in Reading from Illinois State and am currently working on a second Masters in Curriculum and Instruction. Each month, I'll be giving you tips and tricks to help make your child's experiences with reading and writing a positive one! RHYME TIME!

PHONEMIC AWARENESS is the ability to hear and manipulate sounds in words. Having a STRONG phonological awareness is a precursor to being a STRONG reader! Here are some activities you can do to help promote phonemic awareness on the car ride to your home or after school activities:



Say, "I spy something in the car that begins with /s/." Let your child guess the object. For /s/ it might be seat or seat belt. Take turns being the caller and the finder. Make it more challenging, and say, "I see something that rhymes with

count the words 12345

Have your child make two fists. Say a sentence and then have your child say it with you. As each word is said, tell your child to put up one finger. Count how many words are in the sentence. This activity helps your child build an awareness of words.

CLAP THE SYLLABLES

Clapping is a fun hands-on way to determine parts (syllables) of a word. Say a word and have your child clap the parts of the word.

LISTEN TO MUSIC...THEN CREATE YOUR OWN PARODY

My kids LOVE this one! We use songs we know and make up our own words, with an emphasis on rhyming. We change the topic of the song to something we think is funny/entertaining.

PLAY WITH BEGINNING SOUNDS

Have your child name something they see outside their window. Repeat the word and ask, "What sound do you hear at the beginning of _____?" Then, say the word again and let your child respond wih the correct beginning sound.
