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COLD WEATHER DRESS REMINDERS

As the colder weather approaches, it is important for our students to continue to have outdoor recess whenever possible. Outside recess allows students to take a break from wearing their masks/face coverings, be active and enjoy a little fresh air. Typically, students will go outside when the temperature or wind chill is 10 degrees or higher. Recess is about 20 minutes long (a little less by the time the students get coats, hats, gloves/mittens, scarves, boots, etc..on!), so we try to get our students outside as much as the weather allows. There will be times when it's simply too cold or windy to go outside. We do allow students to play in the snow on occasion; students will need to have snow pants and snow boots on to play in the snow. It is important that children are appropriately dressed for outside play. Please make sure that your child has cold weather clothing-coats (with zippers that work), hats, gloves/mittens, scarves, snow boots, snow pants-so that they can play outside on cold weather days and stay warm. We appreciate your help in making sure our students are appropriately dressed!



Changes to Kindergarten-Third Grade Christmas Programs

Each year in December, our Kindergarten through Third Grade classes, under the leadership of Mr. Rocke, our general music teacher, present their Christmas programs at the Bertha Frank Performing Arts Center at Morton High School on two nights. Obviously, this year our Christmas program presentations will look a bit different. We are not able to perform live for an inside audience, and we can't have more than 50 people gathered in one place at a time. However, we feel we have come up with a creative way for students to participate in their traditional Christmas programs while still being able to share the presentations with our families.

We have set aside December 14th and December 15th as "recording days" for our K-3rd grade students. We will shuttle each CLASS (not grade level) to MHS by bus to record their songs on the stage at Bertha Frank. It will take approximately 1 hour for each class to travel to Bertha Frank, assemble on the stage, perform their songs and lines, then board buses to return to Lincoln. Each class's presentation will be recorded which will be shared with parents later that week.

We will finalize our schedule for both days as we get a bit closer to the date. Students are welcome to "dress up" for school that day by wearing what they would have typically worn if they were performing for a live audience. We'll also have more details about how the videos of the performances will be shared with families in early December.

A big thank you to Mr. Rocke for preparing our students for this unique performance. Also a shout out to our district transportation department who will shuttle students to/from Lincoln all day for those two days.



PLANNING FOR GAMEBALL RUN IS UNDERWAY

We are already beginning to plan for this year's Gameball Run, our district's philanthropic efforts for the Children's Hospital of Illinois, located at OSF-St. Francis in Peoria. Each year, our community comes together to raise funds for the CHOI. These activities include business and personal sponsorships, a 60 minute run at MHS and a wide variety of

fundraising activities at all Morton 709 schools in January and February. Each school identifies a "Miracle Family" and that family's story is highlighted as part of the Gameball Run events. These famílies have utilized the services of CHOI and want to give back by sharing their family's story.

Lincoln School's Miracle Family for 2021 is the Chan Family; parents Matt and Erin, along with their daughter Brooklynn, who is in 4th grade at Lincoln and their "miracle kid," Hudson, who is in 1st grade at Lincoln. As an infant and in early years in his life, Hudson needed medical care provided at the CHOI. After several years Hud needed several surgeries to repair a cleft palate.. We'll learn more about the Chan family story and find out more about Lincoln's Gameball Run efforts in the months ahead. For now, mark Thursday, February 11th as the date for the Gameball Run at MHS. Even with some of the restrictions in place currently, we will plan on the outdoor run on 2/11 at 4 pm. at the MHS track. The Gameball Run committee is planning new ways to engage our community and continue with fundraising efforts, in spite of the pandemic. Be on the lookout for changes to Gameball Run this year to ensure safety for all, while continuing the fundraising efforts.



REMINDERS FOR STAYING HEALTHY DURING COLD AND FLU SEASON

With our cold and flu season upon us, it is good to review some healthy habits for our Morton students! If your child is experiencing any COVID-like symptoms (fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle or body aches, new loss of sense of taste or smell, congestion, sore throat, nausea, diarrhea), students should NOT attend school until determining if symptoms are connected to a possible COVID exposure. As your child's parent, you are most familiar with their medical needs and can make a determination about the need for a COVID test, along with input from your primary care physician. We realize that it's tricky to determine if it's COVID, strep, the flu or just a typical winter sickness. That's

why we suggest contacting your pediatrician to help you in that decision making process.

In addition, we can't emphasize enough the importance of having your child stay at home if you or anyone in your immediate household is awaiting COVID test results. With a positive test result at home, your child could unknowingly be spreading the virus germs to others.

Please know that when our secretaries or our administration request more details about a child's absence, we are only doing so in order to maintain the health and safety of all students. We appreciate your detailed information when reporting your child absent/sick.

In addition, if your child has been diagnosed with strep throat or conjunctivitis, (pink eye), s/he needs to be on the prescribed antibiotic medication for a full 24 hours before returning to school. Remember that emphasizing good hand hygiene (as we do at school) is the BEST way to prevent the spread of germs! It is also not too late to get flu shots, too! This will help with the strains of influenza that the CDC feel will be most prominent this flu season.

Lincoln is Toys for Tots Collection Site

Lincoln Elementary School (as well as all District 709 schools) is again a drop off location for the Toys for Tots program. The Marine Corps collects the NEW toys (not used please), which are given to children in the Peoria area who may not otherwise receive a new toy for Christmas. There is a drop off box located in the hallway just inside the school entrance. We appreciate your consideration and are grateful for your donations. Toys will be collected through Tuesday, December 15th. (Toys are required to quarantine for 72 hours before being distributed. We thank you in advance for your generosity and thoughtfulness.


