Thank You for Keeping the Car Line Moving at Morning Drop Off!

Our car drop off line in the mornings has been moving right along almost every morning! It even seems that the line is starting to drop off by 8:15 am!! Thank you!! We are grateful to all of our parents and drivers who are helping to follow the drop off expectations. Just a couple of reminders for everyone to help us to ensure the safety of all each morning:

-PULL YOUR CAR UP TO THE FAR SIGN, EVEN IF THERE IS NO ONE BEHIND YOU. This is usually the biggest reason that our drop off line gets bogged down. By pulling your car all the way to the far sign (to the fence), it allows more cars to come through the drive and drop off students.

-STUDENTS SHOULD EXIT FROM THE PASSENGER'S SIDE, NOT THE DRIVER'S SIDE. It is not safe for children to exit from the driver's side into the passing car traffic. This also forces children to walk between cars to get to the sidewalk and enter school.

-DO NOT PUT YOUR CAR IN PARK AND GET OUT TO ASSIST YOUR CHILD LEAVING THE CAR. This again significantly slows down the drop off line. If you want to help your child out of the car, give him/her a kiss or a hug, assist with getting a bulky item out of the car, please pull into a parking spot and assist your child there.

-DO NOT DROP OFF YOUR CHILDREN ON NEBRASKA AVENUE AND EXPECT THEM TO CROSS THE CIRCLE DRIVE TO ENTER THE SCHOOL. Some parents think that they can avoid the hassle of drop off by letting kids out on Nebraska and having them walk into the school by crossing in front of all of the traffic. Again...drivers are not looking for students to be crossing and children have to cross between cars to get in the building. While it's more convenient for the driver, it ends up slowing down the car line for everyone else and it makes it a safety concern for students who are crossing alone.

-FOR THOSE PARENTS WHO PARK THEIR CARS AND WALK THEIR STUDENTS INTO THE BUILDING: Please make sure that you look and wait, then cross when directed to cross in front of the cars. Don't just immediately cross, thinking that drivers see you and will stop. (This isn't Kroger or Wal-Mart where people walk out

of the store and into the crosswalk without looking at the cars!) Be aware of the cars, drivers and other students when you are crossing with your student.

We greatly appreciate your help to ensure a safe, stress free and hassle free morning drop off for EVERYONE! Thank you!!



Like a Good Neighbor...

We realize that parking around our school at the end of the school day and during school events can be challenging. Imagine being a neighbor to Lincoln School who wants to enter/exit their driveways during this time. It's nearly impossible! Please help us to be good neighbors to those who live directly across the street from Lincoln School:

-Do not block the driveways. You might be thinking "I'll only be here for just a few minutes" or "Maybe they aren't home right now." But just when you think that, the neighbor might be trying to leave his home or turn into her own driveway, only to find it blocked. Please be considerate and don't block driveways!

-Don't turn around in the driveways. Again, please be considerate to our school neighbors. Just because their driveway is across the street from the school, that doesn't mean their driveways are public turnarounds.

-Don't make U-turns in the middle of Nebraska Avenue. We frequently see this. A parent will drop off or pick up their child, then try to make a quick U-turn in front of the school rather than drive around the block. We know it takes a few more minutes to drive around the block. But it's also safer than making the U-turn in the middle of the road. Please be considerate of other drivers on Nebraska Avenue...don't make U-turns!

It's hard to believe that the events of September 11th, 2001 happened twenty years ago. Our annual Patriot Day Assembly will be presented on Friday, 9/10, and it will again be presented in a digital format. DEADLINES FOR PHYSICALS AND IMMUNIZATIONS QUICKLY APPROACHING!

If you have not turned in your child's school physical or updated immunizations (depending on grade level), please remember that Friday, October 15th is the deadline for those documents. In the past, Morton CUSD 709 has accepted appointment cards and notes regarding future appointments after the October 15th deadline. Our policy has changed in that we will NO LONGER ACCEPT APPOINTMENT NOTES OR CARDS in lieu of having physicals and immunizations turned in by the October 15th deadline. COVID Reminders:

If someone in your family household is either testing for COVID or awaiting COVID test results, we ask that you keep all children home from school until the test results are known. We have had many situations this school year where children are sent to school while a parent or other family member is either testing or awaiting test results. In most of the situations, the parent/family tests positive, then the students need to be taken out of school and quarantined. If the child subsequently tests positive for COVID, then we have to trace for close contact here at school. Those situations could be avoided if students stay home when family members are testing and do not risk exposure to others here at school. We appreciate your help in following this guideline. If you have a specific question before sending a child to school, please call Ms. Albers or Nurse Jen for guidance.

The One and Only Ivan

(Grades 3-6)



Ivan is a gorilla living at the Big Top Mall and Video Arcade. He has grown accustomed to humans watching him through the glass walls and does not miss life in the jungle. Instead, Ivan thinks about TV shows he has seen and about his friends Stella, an elderly elephant, and Bob, a stray dog. Mostly

Ivan thinks about art and how to capture the taste of a mango or the sound of leaves with color and a well-placed line. When he meets Ruby, a baby elephant taken from her family, she makes Ivan see things through new eyes. When Ruby arrives, change comes with her, and it's up to Ivan to make it a change for the better.

Fountas & Pinnell Benchmark Assessment

At the beginning of the year, teachers are busy getting to know their students and how to best support their needs. At Lincoln, we use various forms of assessment to inform our instruction. One of the main reading assessments we use is the Fountas and Pinnell Benchmark Assessment System (F&P BAS).

The F&P BAS is a one-on-one assessment that helps teachers identify reading goals and inform literacy instruction. When your child participates in the assessment, he will read a book aloud to his teacher and talk with the teacher about each book. This allows the teachers to get to know each student as a reader and monitor their progress throughout the year. It's always exciting to see the growth that happens between each assessment!

You can help your child progress by doing the following at home:

- 1. Visit the local library together. Encourage your child to select books that interest and excite him.
- 2. Read books to or with your child and talk about them together.
- 3. Listen to your child read books and talk about them together.
- 4. Most importantly, enjoy your time together reading, writing, and talking!
