## Class Lists and Placement for the 2022-2023 School Year

During the past several weeks, I have had parents contact me regarding planning for the 2022-2023 school year. I would like to outline my rationale and the procedures and guidelines for considerations of class assignments for the upcoming school year.

First of all, our teachers, Mrs. Peterson and I take a great deal of time and thought into the process. We consider teaching and learning styles, balanced academic groupings, social considerations, peer relationships and other factors that may impact children in each section. In addition,
we consider special education needs, reading/math needs and other special circumstances when creating the lists.

The teachers will present the tentative class lists to administration before the end of the school year, and I will work to make final adjustments and changes to the lists, as needed. Class placement and teacher assignment is communicated in August
AFTER registration to accommodate for students who move in and out of the district during the summer.

While parents are certainly welcome to provide information to me that they feel may be used in determining lists, IT IS BY NO MEANS A GUARANTEE THAT A CHILD WILL BE ASSIGNED TO A PARTICULAR TEACHER'S CLASS. Students will not be assigned to a class simply because a parent makes a request for that teacher. In addition, fluctuating enrollment may necessitate moving a teacher to a different grade level prior to the start of the school year.

If you feel that there is an extenuating circumstance that should be considered when class lists are created, this information should be communicated in writing to Mrs. Horchem no later than Friday, May 27th, 2022. If you have any questions about this process, please contact Mrs. Horchem.


## End of Year Notes From Nurse Jennifer Cook

It's not too soon to be thinking about and planning for the next school year! Our school nurse, Jen Cook has information to share regarding physicals and immunizations. Reminder...when making your summer plans, don't forget to schedule your dental and physical exams. All incoming kindergarten students will need a physical, dental and eye exam, along with updated immunizations. All incoming 2nd graders will need a dental exam. All incoming 6th grade students will need a dental exam, physical exam and any required immunization updates.
The deadline for these exams is Saturday. October 15th. Please remember that the school district will no longer accept
"appointment cards" for a future appointment for those students who are not in compliance on October 15th. Any student who is not in compliance after

October 15th will be excluded from school and will be marked unexcused.

The sooner that you are able to take care of the exams and immunizations, the better! Exam forms are available in the main office and at your health care provider's office. You may also email your completed forms to jennifer.cook@mcusd709.org


## ANNUAL SCHOOL PICNIC TO BE HELD ON FRIDAY, MAY 20TH

One of our favorite end of year activities is our annual all school picnic. The Annual Lincoln End of Year School Picnic will be held on

Families may use their prepaid Meal Magic Lunch account funds to purchase meals ahead of time on Picnic Day. Only cash or check will be accepted on the day of the picnic (no credit card sales).

Our PTO has arranged to have three dessert food trucks at Lincoln during Picnic Day. Kamaela's Kreamery, Grandma Nana's and The Baking Baer will all be here each with different dessert treats available for purchase. These trucks will be parked in the circle drive in front of the school. Because of the increased pedestrian/child traffic with these trucks, we will keep our parking lot open only for handicapped accessible parking from 10:45-1:15 pm on Picnic
Day. Thanks to our Lincoln PTO for arranging such special treats for Picnic Day!

## End of Year Housekeeping

As we approach the end of the school year, there are always a few housekeeping items to remind families of:
> -Library Books: Our students will no longer be checking out library books for the remainder of the school year. Mrs. Poshard has lots of other activities planned and our students will continue to visit the library during their weekly library time through the end of the year. Mrs. Poshard will continue to email overdue notices to students/families. Please remember that if your child is missing a library book, it needs to be returned or the cost of replacing the book paid in order to receive your child's report card on 5/27.

School Lunch/Milk Charges: Friday, May 20th will be the last day that students can charge for extra milk with their lunches.
All outstanding lunch/milk charges need to be paid in full in order to receive your child's report card on 5/27. Remaining funds on your child's account are transferred to next year (including those going to MJHS).

Missing Text Books: If your student is missing a textbook or classroom library book, it also needs to be returned or the cost of the book paid in order to receive your child's report card on May 27th.
iPad Damages: We will begin collecting student iPads soon. You will be contacted if your child's iPad has any damages which need to be taken care of before the end of the school year.

## Don't Forget to Pre-Register

If you have a child who will be 5 years old on or before September 1, 2022, it is time to begin the kindergarten registration process.

1. Please complete this FORM as soon as possible.
2. On July 28th, you will attend registration day at your neighborhood school to pay your school fees, provide the documents listed below, and sign-up for kindergarten round-up.
3. On August 2nd, new families will receive their official school assignments. Every effort will be made to place new families in their neighborhood schools, but that is not always possible due to class size limits.
4. On August 4th, you and your child will attend kindergarten round-up at your assigned school.
5. On August 8 th, your child's teacher assignment will be available in PowerSchool.
6. On August 11th, your child will attend his/her first day of school!
