COLD WEATHER DRESS REMINDERS

Though we've had beautiful fall and unseasonably warm temperatures, we know that cold winter weather will soon be here. Even with colder temperatures, it is important for our students to continue to have outdoor recess whenever possible. Outside recess allows students to be active and enjoy a little fresh air. Typically, students will go outside when the temperature or wind chill is 10 degrees or higher. Recess is about 20 minutes long (a little less by the time the students get coats, hats, gloves/mittens, scarves, boots, etc..on!), so we try to

get our students outside as much as the weather allows. There will be times when it's simply too cold or windy to go outside. We do allow students to play in the snow on occasion; students will need to have snow pants and snow boots on to play in the snow. It is important that children are appropriately dressed for outside play. Please make sure that your child has cold weather clothing-coats (with zippers that work), hats, gloves/mittens, scarves, snow boots, snow pants-so that they can play outside on cold weather days and stay warm. We appreciate your help in making sure our students are appropriately dressed!

Please remember that our school dress code has changed in that students should "dress for the weather," meaning that there is no requirement for when students can/can't wear shorts during the school year. We remind students and parents to keep in mind that we will go outside for recess as much as the weather allows us to.



Kindergarten-Third Grade Christmas Programs to be Presented in December

Each year in December, our Kindergarten through Third Grade classes, under the leadership of Mr. Rocke, our general music teacher, present their Christmas programs at the Bertha Frank Performing Arts Center at Morton High School on two nights. Reminders for Drop Off Time in the Morning

As the weather starts to turn to colder mornings and more winter-like weather, more and more students will be dropped off at school in the mornings. Anyone who has dropped off their student anytime after 8 am knows how congested it can be coming from both the north and south on S. Nebraska Avenue, turning into Lincoln School. You must have a bit of patience on those mornings!

Both of our crossing guards-Ms. Konieczny and Mrs. Hardman-do their very best to make sure all students are able to safely cross the roads near the school. Cars turning into the parking lot coming from the north seem to have the most difficulty with our drop off procedures around that time. We'd like to remind everyone that a driver headed south cannot start to turn into the lot and block the northbound traffic on Nebraska. Please make sure that you have left room behind your car for traffic on Nebraska Avenue when you turn into the lot and that you are not blocking the driveway.

We realize the beginning of the day procedures can be a bit frustrating, especially if you are waiting in line to drop off. Everyone needs to have a bit of patience at drop off time. There are very little to no traffic issues when parents drop off between 7:45-8 am, so you might consider an earlier drop off time to accommodate your family needs.



PLANNING FOR GAMFBALL RUN IS UNDERWAY

We are already beginning to plan for this year's Gameball Run, our district's philanthropic efforts for the Children's Hospital of Illinois, located at OSF-St. Francis in Peoria. This will be the 11th year of this amazing community event, and the 11th year that Lincoln Elementary School has participated in Gameball Run! Each year, our community comes together to raise funds for the CHOI. These activities include business and personal sponsorships, a 60 minute run at MHS and a wide variety of fundraising activities at all Morton 709 schools in January and February. Each school identifies a "Miracle Family" and that family's story is highlighted as part of the Gameball Run events. These famílies have utilized the services of CHOI and want to give back by sharing their family's story.

Lincoln School's Miracle Family for 2023 is the Wertz Family; parents Bob and Darci, along with their son Grant, who attends MHS and their "miracle kid," Colton who is in 5th grade at Lincoln. We'll learn more about the Wertz family story, how CHOI has impacted their lives and find out more about Lincoln's Gameball Run efforts in the months ahead. REMINDERS FOR STAYING HEALTHY DURING COLD AND FLU SEASON

With our cold and flu season upon us, it is good to review some healthy habits for our Morton students! We want students to be at school as much as possible, but if your child is not fever free for 24 hours, has vomited within the last 24 hours or has flu-like symptoms (uncontrolled coughing, congestion, lingering sore throat, etc.), we as that you keep them at home until they are well. As your child's parent, you are most familiar with their medical needs and can make a determination about the need for any kind of test, along with input from your primary care physician. We realize that it's tricky sometimes to determine if it's strep, the flu, just a typical winter sickness or even COVID.

Please know that when our administrative assistants or our administration request more details about a child's absence, we are only doing so in order to maintain the health and safety of all students. We appreciate your detailed information when reporting your child absent/sick.

In addition, if your child has been diagnosed with strep throat or conjunctivitis, (pink eye), s/he needs to be on the prescribed antibiotic medication for a full 24 hours before returning to school. Remember that emphasizing good hand hygiene (as we do at school) is the BEST way to prevent the spread of germs! It is also not too late to get flu shots, too! This will help with the strains of influenza that the CDC feel will be most prominent this flu season.

Lincoln is Toys for Tots Collection Site



News From Mrs. Poshard and the Library


