

# February 2023 From The Principal's Desk 

Dear Lincoln Families,
Happy February! February is the shortest month of the year...yet it is a very busy month for our Lincoln staff, students and families! We have kicked off our Gameball Run fundraising activities with Coin Wars and are excited about our other fundraising activities ahead of the 2023 Gameball Run on February 9th. This month we will also host our Literati Book Fair and welcome families and guests for our Open House on February 16th. Our 4th and 5th graders will present their recorder and chimes concerts later on in February. It's a busy, busy month!!

Gameball Run 2023 is just around the corner! We had an exciting week of Coin Wars two weeks ago with a back and forth "battle" among many grades for most of the week! In the end, our 6th grade students collected the most points and won the competition. The third graders finished in second place, and the second graders came in third place. We finished with just over $\$ 9,600$ for the four day collection, which is just an incredible total! That was about $\$ 1500$ more than we collected in last year's Coin Wars total! Simply amazing! Thank you to everyone who contributed in some way! PTO will provide our sixth graders with dessert at lunch later this month, while our second and third grade students will receive an additional recess outside...once it warms up a bit!

What's still to come for Gameball Run:
-Pop-A-Shot Days during PE-Thursday, $2 / 2$ and Friday, 2/3: For a $\$ 2$ donation, a student can shoot baskets for 30 seconds. Our PTO volunteers will document the number of shots made. Students making 10 or more shots will have their name go into a drawing for a prize, while the boy and girl at each grade level with the most number of made baskets will win a prize as well. Students can shoot more than one time on each day, as time allows. They will have an opportunity to do this during their PE time.
-Gameball Run Run Day at MHS-Thursday, 2/9: The run begins at 4 pm . Students can meet the Lincoln staff and other students on the field at approximately 3:45 pm for a group picture. The run begins at 4 pm and students will be able to walk or run on the track from $4-5 \mathrm{pm}$. There will be concessions available for purchase. Run or walk for as long or as short as you wish once the event begins. Be sure to make sure your child wears his/her bib in order to be on the track and for the free popcorn coupon on the bib! -Gameball Run Game Day-Friday, 2/10:Wear your Gameball Run purple t-shirt to school on Friday in support of the Gameball Run Game. Wearing this shirt to the boys basketball game at MHS on Friday night also gets you into the game for free!

We look forward to seeing you and your family later on this month at our Lincoln School Open House on Thursday, February 16th from 6-7:30 pm. Stop by anytime with
your family between that time to see your child's classroom, visit other areas of the school and shop at our Literati Book Fair in the cafeteria.

We've made it to the 100th Day of School (on January 27th)! We continue to be grateful for your continued support, flexibility and diligence in keeping healthy kids in school and for your understanding of those situations when quarantines are required, which fortunately has not been very often. Even though it's only February, it's not too soon to be thinking about the next school
year. Nurse Jen wants to remind all parents of our Kindergarten, 2nd and 6th grade students that dental exams are due to be turned in by May 15th, 2023. Most of these required exams have been turned in, but there are still a few students who need to submit their dental exams.

She'd also like to remind parents to be looking ahead to next year...
-1st grade parents can turn in a dental exam dated after November 15th, 2022 to use for their student's $2 n d$ grade dental exam. -5th grade parents can turn in a dental exam dated after November 15th, 2022 to use for their student's 6th grade dental exam. They can also turn in a completed school physical dated on or after August 11th, 2022 for their student's 6th grade physical exam. Incoming 6th grade students must also have up to date immunizations including a Tdap and a Meningitis vaccine after age 11.

The survey will take approximately 10 minutes to complete. In addition, we hope to gain your insight on the
following five components found to be critical for school success:

1. Effective Leaders: The principal works with teachers to implement a clear and strategic vision for school success.
2. Collaborative Teachers: Teachers collaborate to promote professional growth.
3. Involved Families: The entire school staff builds strong relationships with families and communities to support learning.
4. Supportive Environment: The school is safe and orderly. Teachers have high expectations for students and support students to realize their goals. Classmates also support one another.
5. Ambitious Instruction: Classes are academically demanding and engage students by emphasizing the application of knowledge.
