Kindergarten Pre-Registration is Coming Soon!

It's already time to start planning for the 2023-2024 school year! One of the first tasks in the new school year planning is pre-registering our incoming Kindergarten students for school this spring. This year, we will again hold our Screening and Round Up in early August after registration. Soon, we will be asking the parents of children who will be attending kindergarten in August 2023 to complete the pre-registration process online. This is for children who reside in the Morton CUSD 709 School District and will be five years old by

September 1, 2023.

Steps for our incoming kindergarten parents:

- 1. Please complete the Google Registration Form WHEN it is made available to our families. (The form is coming soon!!)
- 2. In May, elementary principals will review the pre-registration forms to determine building placement for the pre-registered students.
- 3. In June, students who have pre-registered by May 15th will receive a Welcome to Kindergarten letter that indicates your child's anticipated school placement. Parents will then receive an email with directions for setting up your parent access to the PowerSchool Portal.

- 4. On Thursday, August 3rd, you will attend registration day in person at your neighborhood school to pay your school fees, provide the documents listed below, and sign-up for kindergarten round-up.
- 5. On Tuesday, August 8th, families that pre-register after the deadline will receive their official school assignments. Every effort will be made to place new families in their neighborhood schools, but that is not always possible due to class size limits.
- 6. On Thursday, August 10th, you and your child will attend kindergarten round-up at your assigned school.
- 7. On Monday, August 14th, your child's teacher assignment will be available in PowerSchool.
- 8. On Wednesday, August 16t, your child will attend his/her first day of school.

Documents you will provide on registration day (August 3rd):

- Original certified birth certificate (must have before your child can start school)

IAR Testing to Begin in March

Our students take federally required assessments every spring. These assessments help us understand how our students are growing academically, compared to their peers across the state. The state uses this information to provide more support and resources to the schools in the greatest need. This year, the English Language Arts and Math assessment for grades 3-6 is called the Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR). The Illinois Assessment of Readiness measures the same Illinois Learning Standards and includes the same high-quality test questions that teachers and students have become familiar with over the past four years.

Our students should feel confident showing what they know and can do on the Illinois Assessment of Readiness. Our students will take the Illinois Assessment of Readiness in April, starting the week of March 13th. A specific testing schedule will be determined soon and communicated with 3rd-6th grade parents in the coming days.

Then later in April, our 5th grade students will take the state's science assessment called Illinois Science Assessment (ISA). The assessment changed that 5th graders will take three sections of the ISA, each approximately 50 minutes in length. We will again communicate with 5th grade parents about the testing dates when we return from spring break.


