IAR Testing to Begin in April

Our students take federally required assessments every spring. These assessments help us understand how our students are growing academically, compared to their peers across the state. The state uses this information to provide more support and resources to the schools in the greatest need. This year, the English Language Arts and Math assessment for grades 3-6 is called the Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR).

The Illinois Assessment of Readiness measures the same Illinois Learning Standards and includes the same high-quality test questions that teachers and students have become familiar with over the past several years.

Our students should feel confident showing what they know and can do on the Illinois Assessment of Readiness. Our students will take the Illinois Assessment of Readiness in April, starting the week of April 8th. A specific testing schedule will

be determined soon and communicated with 3rd-6th grade parents prior to spring break .

Then later in April, our 5th grade students will take the state's science assessment called Illinois Science Assessment (ISA). The assessment changed that 5th graders will take three sections of the ISA, each approximately 50 minutes in length. We will again communicate with 5th grade parents about the testing dates when we return from spring break.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

It is time again for our annual Erin's Law Presentations. Erin's Law (PA97-1147) passed in 2014 and mandates that Illinois public schools provide training to certified staff on prevention of child sexual abuse. It also mandates that public school children pre-kindergarten through 12th grade be educated on body safety rules and how to protect themselves from a perpetrator. This program is designed to introduce elementary students to the subject of child sexual abuse in an easy to understand, non-threatening way. This year, our Erin's Law Lessons will be presented by The Center for Prevention of Abuse. Lessons at Lincoln will occur at every grade level on Thursday, April 4th or Friday, April 5th. A school social worker or school psychologist will be present during all lessons.

All lessons will review personal body safety rules, safe touches, and defining safe people through videos or books. Upper elementary students will also learn about good vs. bad secrets, advocating for themselves, and how to use social media appropriately.

Some points the program emphasizes are:

- Their bodies are their own.
- There's a difference between good touches and bad touches.
- Only they can decide whether a touch feels good or bad.
- They can say "No!" or "Stop that!" to unwanted touches.
- The parts of their body covered by their bathing suits are private.
- There's a difference between keeping good secrets and keeping bad secrets.
- If someone gives them a bad touch, it is not their fault.
- The "touching rule" says that no one can touch their private parts except to keep them clean and healthy.
- If someone breaks the "touching rule," they must tell an identified, trusted grown-up.
- If the first grown-up doesn't believe their story, they should keep telling until they find someone who will help.

We hope all parents will partner with us to educate our children. Please contact me if this is a concern for you. Parents have also asked questions about participation for a child who has been abused; we will work with parents and students on an individual basis to make the best decision for that student. If you have any questions about the materials being presented, please contact me or our school social worker, Mrs. Winkler. Parents are also encouraged to visit the Morton District 709 website to find more information on Erin's Law under parent resources to guide you in discussions at home. Additional materials and discussion starters will be sent home after the presentations are completed.
